



Fact Sheet

Volunteers in Medicine (VIM) is the only national nonprofit dedicated to the development of a network of free clinics based on the VIM model, which emphasizes the use of retired health care professionals and community volunteers to care for America's uninsured. VIM's mission is to promote and guide the development of a national network of free clinics using these dedicated volunteers to address the needs of this underserved population.

All VIM clinics provide general primary care and patient education programs. Specialized services range from pediatrics and dentistry to ophthalmology and counseling. Diabetes, hypertension, asthma, acute respiratory infection, depression and anxiety are the diseases most frequently treated in VIM clinics.

In 2009, over 100,000 patients made more than 325,000 visits to the then 77 VIM clinics. Nearly 11,000 medical and non-medical volunteers provided over 500,000 hours of service in these clinics.

McNeil Consumer & Specialty Pharmaceuticals, makers of Tylenol®, has been the sustaining financial source for the VIM national office. In 2009, VIM also received funding from McKesson Medical-Surgical and the McKesson Foundation to support direct patient care provided in VIM clinics. VIM partners with AARP, American Academy of Family Physicians (AAFP) and the National Council of Churches Health Care Task Force to build awareness and further the mutual goals of each organization.
